We also gather biennially at different presidential sites to celebrate the life and contributions of one of America's presidents.





OUR INITIATIVES

- In association with The Roosevelt School at Long Island University, we help Americans learn more about their civic responsibilities through programs ranging from educating students about how our government works to hosting influential leaders, providing them a platform to discuss a major issue of the day and propose solutions. In conjunction with LIU, we will offer scholarships to students studying government and the presidency.
- We encourage new books on the presidency and offer a biennial monetary prize awarded at a gala event for the best book on presidential leadership.
- We foresee numerous other projects, including contests; the
 creation of lesson plans for schools and college courses;
 publishing a journal devoted to presidential studies; hosting
 public on-line forums on presidential issues; creating a series of
 podcasts; initiating an award for innovative projects at presidential
 sites; providing presidential descendants as speakers for schools,
 retirement homes, and other institution; and other projects.
- We will organize biennial meetings of descendants and guests at different presidential sites, including public events such as symposia and gala fundraising dinners.

TWEED ROOSEVELT

President

Tweed Roosevelt, President and Co-founder of The Society of Presidential Descendants, is Chairman of The Roosevelt School at LIU, where he is a University Professor.

Tweed has focused for many years on preserving Theodore Roosevelt's memory and legacy, on conservation, and on civic education in the U.S. He has held various roles at the Theodore Roosevelt Association, which is dedicated to TR's memory. He has written and lectured extensively on TR and other subjects. He spearheaded the effort to have TR awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor, and he has retraced many of TR's adventures in Africa, South America, and the American West.

Tweed has taught at Harvard, Columbia and other schools and universities. He also has had a successful business career.



MASSEE MCKINLEY

Vice President and Chief of Staff

Massee McKinley's paternal ancestor is the 25th U.S. President William McKinley. He is the great-great nephew of McKinley. McKinley's maternal ancestor is the 22nd and 24th US President Grover Cleveland.

McKinley is the founding partner of Peerage Communications, LLC, an executive and political communications boutique consulting firm headquartered in Atlanta, Georgia. He has written for the likes of Delta Airlines, The Coca-Cola Company, LVMH (Louis Vuitton), Hermès and Ferragamo. McKinley has also written for three former United States House Speakers.

Vice President

Lynda Johnson Robb is the daughter of President Lyndon Baines Johnson. She has served as a member of the Selection Board of the President's Commission on White House Fellowships.

Among of her past affiliations include a presidential appointment by Jimmy Carter to serve as chair of the President's Advisory Committee for Women (1979-1981), chair of the Virginia's Women Cultural History Project (1982-1985), Vice Chair of Americans Promise and chair of the Virginia Task Force on Infant Mortality. She also received a congressional appointment to serve as commissioner of the National Commission to Prevent Infant Mortality (1989-1996).

Clifton Truman Daniel is the oldest grandson of President Harry S. Truman. He is the son of author Margaret Truman and former *New York Times* Managing Editor E. Clifton Daniel Jr.

Mr. Daniel is honorary chairman of the board of the Truman Library Institute and board secretary of the Harry S. Truman Scholarship Foundation. He is the author of *Growing Up With My Grandfather: Memories of Harry S. Truman* and *Dear Harry, Love Bess: Bess Truman's Letters to Harry Truman, 1919-1943*.

INAUGURAL GALA WEEKEND

June 10-12, 2022

The first biennial gathering of The Society of Presidential Descendants will honor Theodore Roosevelt at his home, Sagamore Hill, in the town of Oyster Bay, N.Y., on Long Island, and at nearby Long Island University, the administrative home of The Society, on June 10–12, 2022.

The gathering will start on Friday night with a dinner featuring local delicacies, including lobsters and oysters at Long Island University President Kimberly R. Cline's home, McGrath House, and gardens on the LIU campus, the former home of E. F. Hutton and Marjorie Merriweather Post. On Saturday morning a symposium of leading scholars and others examine TR's life and legacy. In the afternoon TR's great-grandson, Tweed Roosevelt, and other family members will lead private tours of Sagamore Hill.

The early evening will feature a panel of presidential descendants sharing personal stories about their ancestors and how they deal with the burden of having such a famous ancestor. At the gala dinner, held on the campus of LIU, Pulitzer Prize winner Doris Kearns Goodwin, this year's winner of the prestigious Society's Distinguished Presidential Historian Award will share insights into the presidency and Theodore Roosevelt, gained from a lifetime of study.
